Creating Excellent Choral Music for 25 Years

Founded in 1998, MCCL began as a choir of 31 singers under the direction of artistic director Patricia Strong Myers. She desired to create a space for children to experience excellent choral music education within the church.



Since then, MCCL has grown to include auditioned and non-auditioned choral opportunities for over 150 children and youth in kindergarten through grade 12. Singers represent more than 40 churches, 45 schools, and 12 denominations. Singers come from communities
